Through our theme for the year, he is asking Rotarians to Lend a Hand, not only to increase our membership but also to retain members. Other areas he would like to emphasize are to encourage us to Lend a Hand and address health concerns and promote literacy and education.

Literacy Month

July has been designated as Literacy month by Rotary International. The purpose is to promote greater awareness among all Rotarians of the importance of literacy to the overall well-being of every individual in a community, as well as the direct relationship on a community's literacy level to its standard of living.

The objectives are to increase understanding of the standard of living for each individual as well as the community at large. To further promote awareness of functional literacy as the right of each individual to have the reading and writing skills necessary to participate fully and with dignity in all aspects of Community life. To continue to identify and develop resources that will support community literacy efforts.

One of the programs that Southwest Rotary has in place that addresses this issue is the: **ROTA-Reader Book Bag Program.** The club provides a book bag to each first grade class in the district. The Rota-Reader bag is filled with books, a puppet, reading activities, surveys for parents and additional information on other reading materials suggested for first grades. This program promotes interest in reading at home with a parent or older sibling. The bag is rotated weekly so that each child may take the bag home. This program is coordinated by the reading coordinator for the school district. The club budgets for yearly maintenance on bags and books.
