Darrell Collins will be our speaker. Darrell is a native of North Carolina's Outer Banks and resides in Manteo, on Roanoke Island. He Graduated from Manteo High School in 1973. He is a graduate of Elizabeth City State University in North Carolina and holds a B.S. degree in Geology. He has worked with the National Park Service in the division of interpretation and education for 24 years, spending the majority of his time at the Wright Brothers National Memorial, where he serves as the Historian. He served with NASA in a series of educational programs promoting aviation and the Wright Brothers to young children. In 1990 he was nominated as the National Park Service top Interpretive Ranger for the Freeman Tilden Award. In 1991 he was nominated by the Department of Interior to represent the National Park Service for the "Park Ranger Tour Program," an outreach program for children in e major U.S. cities.

For the past fourteen years he has been on the aviation/aerospace lecture circuit. Previous speaking engagements include the Aero Club of Washington's Wright Memorial Dinner, National Air Transportation 50th Anniversary, Aerospace Industries of America,

Aircraft Owners and Pilot Association. He is a regular speaker at the Speakers' Showcase series at the Oshkosh Fly-in Convention and many other aviation/aerospace oriented groups.
