Ambassadorial Scholarships

District 6270 will offer one ambassadorial Scholarship for study abroad during the academic year 2005-2006. Each club may nominate one applicant by July 1, 2004, to:

Interviews will take place on Saturday, August 28, 2004, at Milwaukee's War Memorial. In addition, each club may nominate one applicant for the World Peace and Conflict Resolution Scholarship (With the same deadlines).

The Rotary Foundation's oldest and Ambassadorial best-known program is Scholarships. Since 1947 more than 30,000 men and women from 100 nations have studied abroad under its auspices. Today it is world's largest privately funded the international scholarships program. More than 1,100 scholarships were awarded for study in Through 2002-03. grants totaling approximately US\$26 million, recipients from some 69 countries studied in more than 64 nations.

The purpose of the Ambassadorial Scholarships program is to further international understanding and friendly relations among people of different countries. The program sponsors several types of scholarships for undergraduate and graduate students as well as for qualified professionals pursuing vocational studies. While abroad, scholars serve as ambassadors of goodwill to the of the host country and people give presentations about their homelands to Rotary clubs and other groups. Upon returning home, scholars share with Rotarians and others the experiences that led to greater understanding of their host countries.

Scholarship/Grant availability depends on your district' s contributions to The Rotary Foundation and which programs your district leadership chooses to support with available funds. Under the SHARE system, all district general contributions to the Annual Programs Fund are totaled at the end of the year and then divided into two funds, with 60 percent being credited to the District Designated Fund and 40 percent to the World Fund. The World Fund is used by The Rotary Foundation to underwrite many of its programs, such as 3-H Grants, Matching Grants, and Group Study Exchange, among others, while the District Designated Fund may be used at the district's discretion to participate in other Foundation programs such as Ambassadorial Scholarships or Grants for University Teachers.
