INDIA IMMUNIZATION DAY NOT YOUR TYPICAL DAY One hundred thousand (100000) Indian Rotarians, Rotractors, Intractors & Innerwheel members are committed to eradicate Polio from India by 2005 itself as per the Goal set by Rotary International, so join us. Do you know what is involved in the Polio Immunization campaign in India ? Here are some facts.......1) 640,000 vaccination booths. 2) 2.3 million vaccinators. 3) 1.1 million vaccination teams. 4) 137,000 supervisors, with 137,000 vehicles (cars, motorcycles, mopeds, bicycles, boats, elephants, camels or whatever it takes). 5) 200 million doses of Polio Vaccine, carried around the country in 2 million vaccine carrier bags. 6) 6.3 million Ice packs to keep all those doses of Polio Vaccine in the 2 million vaccine carrier bags cold. 7) 191 million homes visited.
8) 170 million children immunized in just one day.

Community Health Screening on March 11 For members of the Community who are interested. Zion Lutheran Church will be the site of a health screening on March 11. On that day, Life Line Screening will scan the carotid artery in the neck for plaque build up, which can lead to STROKE, (75% of all strokes are linked to carotid artery blockage) and the arteries in the legs for peripheral arterial disease, which is linked to heart disease. They also offer a third test for aneurysms in the aortic vessel in the abdomen. Life Line will also offer on that day a bone density screening to test for Osteoporosis. This is a prevention program, and with early detection, these problems can be treated. The results are sent directly to you and referred back to your own doctor. These tests, which are non-invasive, completely painless and take only about ten minutes each, are offered for \$45.00 a piece or the 3 vascular tests for \$109.00. Clients can have the Osteoporosis test for \$45.00 or all 4 tests for \$139.00. Pre-registration is a must. Call 1-800-643-6075 for your appointment or for more information.
