A committee was established by the board to review our invoice collection procedures and banking relationship to make certain our club was running in an economical and efficient manner. The committee reviewed our credit card procedures, alternative methods of collecting accounts receivable and banking offers from members of our club. The group came to the conclusion that the cost of processing credit card transactions outweighed the benefit to the club and recommended those services be discontinued as of March 31, 2005. A club survey of interest in alternative methods of paying invoices determined that payment by check is the preference. ACH and on-line Bill Pay were not favored. The recommendation the board was to collect all invoices by check (or cash). These decisions did not require a change in the banking institution. Satisfaction with our current provider (Oshkosh Community Credit Union) is

high, thus it was suggested we leave the banking relationship as it exists. The board accepted these ideas and passed them all. *Any questions, see Doug Seefeld*

Community Health Screening on March 11 For members of the Community who are interested, Zion Lutheran Church will be the site of a health screening on March 11. that day, Life Line Screening will scan the carotid artery in the neck for plague build up, which can lead to STROKE, (75% of all strokes are linked to carotid artery blockage) and the arteries in the legs for peripheral arterial disease, which is linked to heart disease. They also offer a third test for aneurysms in the aortic vessel in the abdomen. Life Line will also offer on that day a bone density screening to test for Osteoporosis. This is a prevention program, and with early detection, these problems can be treated. The results are sent directly to you and referred back to your own doctor. These tests, which are non-invasive, completely painless and take only about ten minutes each, are offered for \$45.00 a piece or the 3 vascular tests for \$109.00. Clients can have the Osteoporosis test for \$45.00 or all 4 tests for \$139.00. Pre-registration is a must. Call 1-800-643-6075 for your appointment or for more information.
