Congratulation to our Rotary members Kate Thome and Barb Herzog, who, along with substitute Rhonda Gustafson, recently won the 2007 Winnebago County Literacy Council's Corporate Spelling Bee! According to Kate, Rhonda was literally pulled from Festival Foods to help when Glenn Curran was out with the flu and Ken Friedman had just been discharged from the hospital.



Sponsored by ThedaCare Physicians of Oshkosh, this is the sixth year that this event has occurred. Companies throughout Winnebago County participated by paying \$500. to sponsor a three-person team. This year, Corporate Teams included Aurora Health Care, Affinity Health System, The Appleton Post-Crescent, 4-Imprint, The Oshkosh Northwestern, Oshkosh Public Library, Citizens First Credit Union, and both Oshkosh Southwest and Downtown Rotary clubs. For the past four years, the Appleton Post-Crescent has been the undefeated champion.

That changed when the Southwest Rotary Team won the competition by correctly spelling "cedilla." The word is a noun that refers to the mark (,) placed under certain letters in various



languages to indicate pronunciation. Prior to being challenged with spelling "cedilla," the team was able to accurately spell words like, "frondescence," "kipfel," "viscera," "parterre," and "zazen."



Proceeds from this event, which included a silent auction, will benefit adult and family literacy programming. Over \$11,000. was raised at the 2007 event which also included a separate Middle School Spelling Bee. This year, Webster Stanley Middle School emerged as the winner over South Park Middle School, St. John Neumann, Alps Charter School and Merrill Middle School. Barb Herzog, Ph.D., served as one of the judges in this event.
