- High school level Interact club at Oshkosh West. Just as with Jr. Rotary, the Interact club is self-directed and largely selffunded. Our club liason is Kathy Hanson
- UW-Oshkosh Rotaract Club. Again, self-directed and designed to be a stepping stone to Rotary once the students graduate and move into the world.
- Just a few more programs:
 - Each year, our club gives away \$15,000 in scholarships to graduating high-school students and to Fox Valley Tech students.
 - We fund one breakfast a month for the Second Chance Program that is a collaboration between OASD and the Winnebago County Human Services Board
 - o We participate in the annual Back-to-Shool program that gives 60 kids clothes, backpacks and school supplies.
 - The RotaReader book bag program, in its 13th year, provides 2 bags of books to each elementary school that go home, on a rotating basis, to each student.
