The magnitude of this world-wide effort is astonishing:

- o It is estimated that by the time the world is certified polio-free, Rotary's contributions to the global polio eradication effort will exceed \$850 million.
- o To date, 122 nations around the world have benefited from PolioPlus grants.
- o From the launch of the global initiative in 1988, 5 million people, who would otherwise have been paralyzed, will be walking because they have been immunized against polio.


