As reported earlier, problems with the Embassy in Peru were US preventing a student from coming to Oshkosh this year. Although we received help from a US Senator and (Herb Kohl) а US Congressman (Tom Petri), a final decision was handed down and the Peruvian student will not be granted a visa and allowed to travel to the United States. We remain hopeful that changes at the US Embassy will give this student a second chance next year.
