## District 6270 Conference

Catch the Rotary Ball at the 2010 District 6270 Conference from May 14 to 16 in Green Bay. Our club is proudly hosting this year's conference and promises it will be unlike anything you've ever attended before.

**Stay:** The conference will be held at the Green Bay Radisson Hotel and Conference Center and the historic halls of Lambeau Field. Highlights include keynote addresses from former Packer play and current announcer Larry McCarren and "That Nurse Guy" John Shier; tours of the Packers Hall of Fame and Lambeau Field; a dinner and dance with live music from The Groove Hogs in the Lambeau Field Atrium (overlooking the field of play); and plenty of opportunities to learn about the great things Rotary is doing, has done, and will be doing in the coming months.

**Play:** Don't miss the annual golf outing on Friday as Rotarians hit the links at Thornberry Creek at Oneida golf course and try your luck at the Oneida Casino (conveniently connected to the Radisson hotel).

**Stray:** In addition to private guided tours of Lambeau Field, the Green Bay area offers plenty for Rotarians and their guests including shopping, fine dining,

and plenty of local "hot spots" to check out.

Conference registration is just \$119 and you can get \$50 back by volunteering to work a couple hours during the course of the weekend. Plus, hotel rooms are only \$99 each night.
