EAA Picnic

The annual Flying Rotarians EAA Brat Fry and Corn Roast will be held next Wednesday, July 28 at the EAA Nature Center (AirVenture admission is not required to attend). Those wishing to carpool should meet at the offices of Duxstad/Fletcher Wealth Management, 1918 S. Washburn and plan to leave for the EAA grounds at 11:45 a.m.

The guest speaker will be U.S. Army 1st Lt. Brian Brennan. On May 7, 2008, Brennan was seriously injured in Afghanistan when an IED exploded under the humvee in which he was traveling. The attack took the lives of two soldiers and a civilian. Lt. Brennan suffered cardiac arrest, multiple fractures and traumatic brain injury. He returned home a double amputee.

Lt. Brennan's passion to give back and help others facing the same struggles he endured has led to the establishment of the "Brennan Stands Alone Foundation." It was created to ease the burden of routine stress for those injured in the line of duty in order that they may focus on treatment and rehabilitation.

Lt. Brennan will share his story and that of the Foundation with those in attendance.

Rotary Mottoes

Rotary's official mottoes, Service Above Self and One Profits Most Who Serves Best, trace back to the early days of the organization. By 1912, both He Profits Most Who Serves Best and Service Above Self were being used.

At the 1950 RI Convention, slightly modified versions of the two slogans were formally approved: He Profits Most Who Serves Best and Service Above Self. The 1989 [Council on Legislation](#) established Service Above Self as the principal motto of Rotary, because it best conveys the philosophy of unselfish volunteer service. He Profits Most Who Serves Best was modified by the 2004 Council to They Profit Most Who Serve Best and by the 2010 Council to its current wording, One Profits Most Who Serves Best.
