Shared Harvest

Great work continues to be done by volunteers for the Shared Harvest program. Their efforts were recognized by the Oshkosh Northwestern's

Editorial Board on Monday, August 30:

“Every year around this time you head out to your plot to gather some fresh vegetables and herbs for the night's dinner and as your picking you look around. You are surrounded – and not just by plants. The bounty can often be overwhelming.

You have more tomatoes than you could care for. Peppers? There's already half a dozen in the kitchen. And the zucchinis? Well, that'd be a lot of bread.

There's another option: the Oshkosh Rotarians' Shared Harvest program. With the participation of all three Oshkosh Rotary clubs, the United Way and the food pantry, Shared Harvest looks to take in any excess or unwanted, leftover produce to deliver it to help feed those in need at local food pantries.

Donation is simple: Drop off your goods at the Shared Harvest stands at either the Saturday morning farmers market at City Hall or the Tuesday farmers market at Festival Foods; or you can bring donations to the Murdock Avenue or Sawyer Street Associated Bank branches.

Last year the program collected more than 16,000 pounds of food; this year some 5,000 pounds have been donated to the Oshkosh Area Community Pantry.”
