1) **Fighting Hunger:** From Romania to Alaska and all places between, Rotary Foundation contributes to projects that address the maternal and child health needs of communities as well as economic and community development.

2) **Reducing Child Mortality:** Annually, more than 1.8 million children die of diarrhea each year. Proper sanitation can reduce the rate of child mortality in many communities by up to one-third. Programs designed to help improve water and sanitation are essential to solving these problems.

3) **Promoting Peace and Conflict Resolution:** Rotary Foundation is a leader in promoting national and international cooperation, peace and conflict resolution.

4) **Basic Education and Literacy:** Education helps rebuild lives, whether in small rural towns or in war-torn countries. Rotary Foundation supports many global literacy programs.

5) **Eradicating Polio:** Since 1985 this initiative has been going strong and the end of Polio is nearing.

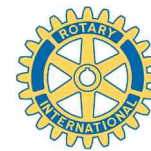
