## End Polio

Sunday, April 12, marketed 60 years since the Salk polio vaccine was declared safe, effective and potent. In that time the number of polio cases has dropped by 99 percent worldwide. With just three countries remaining polio-endemic, we are closer than ever

to eradicating this crippling disease.

In 1988, when Rotary International launched the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) polio continued to cripple children in 125 countries. Today, polio remains endemic only in three: Afghanistan, Nigeria and Pakistan. And it has been more than eight months since Nigeria’s last case, making a polio-free Africa a real possibility.

Salk’s vaccine will play an important role in the end-game strategy against polio when 120 countries introduce IPV into their routine polio immunization systems this year.

As Rotarians we are committed to seeing this disease wiped from the face of the earth. Thank you for what you have done to End Polio Now!
