Circle of Five – Paul Harris Fellow

Last week, the Foundation chairs introduced to the club – the Circle of Five.

The idea behind it is to increase Paul Harris Fellow's in the club, by newer members, and encourage more giving from non-contributing members.

Here's on it works:

Five existing PHF with credits invites a member that wants to become a PHF. The new member agrees to contribute \$2 per week and be willing to continue as a sustaining member of PHF. Each year the 5 credit the new member with \$100 each. At the end of year 2 the new person become a PHF and the group becomes six.

At this time the group can:

-Start a new group or can continue as is based on the group's decision.

-A new member can be identified and the process starts over.

PBIS – Positive Behavior Intervention and Support & The Oshkosh Way

A few weeks ago we had a great presentation on PBIS in the Oshkosh Area School District.

PBIS is a school wide behavior system that addresses behaviors in an effort to increase student achievement and maximize learning. The philosophy is by rewarding students for positive behaviors and providing positive praise and rewards; students will build the internal motivation to behave in a positive way. This, in turn, creates a positive learning environment in all areas of the school which positively impacts student learning.

The initial implementation was school specific; the district wide initiative brought us to branding the "Oshkosh Way" through collaboration with 4 Imprint and the Chamber of Commerce. The Oshkosh Way is the district's connecting plan for and collaborating with the greater Oshkosh Community. The Oshkosh Way represents OASD students being socially competent and community ready.
