A REQUEST FROM PRESIDENT ELECT JOHN HOBBINS

As President elect of the club, I have a request to make. The President elect of Rotary International has asked that every club take stock of the amount of giving clubs are doing in and through the financial, in-kind, and volunteer hour contributions of its individual members. It's a great idea, and will give us a beautiful picture of the value our club has, which is enormous.

With that in mind, please email John Hobbins with the following information (your answers will be kept confidential; only the aggregate results for the club will be publicized):

- (1) Outside of membership dues, meals for yourself, and contributions to the Dick Ames fund at the local foundation and Rotary International, how much other cash or check giving do you do or plan to do through SW Rotary (for which you are billed, or otherwise) on an annual basis?
- (2) How many volunteer hours do you clock or plan to clock in the name of Rotary on an annual basis? Examples of volunteer hours: helping out with the Christmas party, serving on a committee, participating in a fundraiser, helping out with Battle on Bago, organizing a social, preparing for a meeting, corresponding with members of Rotary to show them support, or for club business, going to a district meeting or training event. You can write down a figure like "3 hours a week average."
- (3) How many miles do you clock and how much money do you spend for meals and accommodations and so on, in the course of volunteering in the name of Rotary, on an annual basis, for which you do not ask for reimbursement?

Three questions: thank you for your responses. Please respond by April 16th. That will save us having to follow up again. The numbers do not have to be exact. Just make an estimate.
