I have been working in the field of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault as a Prevention Educator for more than 10 years now. I graduated from the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh with a degree in Criminal Justice with the intentions of becoming a cop. After working an internship where I helped to implement a Restorative Justice program at Merrill Middle school in Oshkosh I began to see the struggles the youth and families were having. It was at this point that I made up my mind to completely transition into wanting to work with youth in hopes of preventing them from having to go down the path of being locked up or arrested. I went on to work as a Behavior Specialist with Lutheran Social Services in Oshkosh to becoming a Children's Advocate at Safe Haven Domestic Abuse Services in Shawano then moved on to working with Christine Ann Domestic Abuse Service. Working at Christine Ann Domestic Abuse has allotted me the opportunity to collaborate with Reach Counseling in a way that both agencies were able to work out a deal to split my position to become a dual educator on domestic violence and sexual assault. For the last two years I've been helping to design and develop programs for both Reach Counseling and Christine Ann to better benefit youth and families.

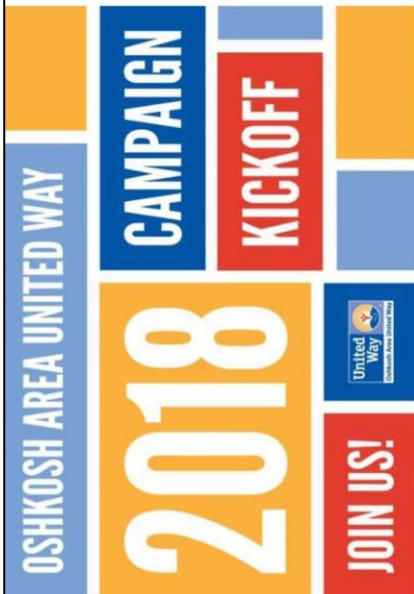

19. A BRIEF ROTARY HISTORY

The world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, USA, was formed on 23 February 1905 by Paul P. Harris, an attorney who wished to recapture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth. The name "Rotary" derived from the early practice of rotating meetings among members' offices.

Rotary's popularity spread throughout the United States in the decade that followed; clubs were chartered from San Francisco to New York. By 1921, Rotary clubs had been formed on six continents, and the organization adopted the name Rotary International a year later.

As Rotary grew, its mission expanded beyond serving the professional and social interests of club members. Rotarians began pooling their resources and contributing their talents to help serve communities in need. The organization's dedication to this ideal is best expressed in its principal motto: Service Above Self. Rotary also later embraced a code of ethics, called The 4-Way Test, that has been translated into hundreds of languages.
