We'll be raising money, playing trivia for a 50/50 prize (\$1 per question, enter as many times as you like) and having fun together at this 3-club social.

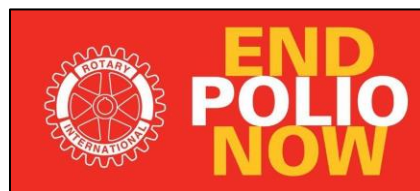
We're also working on some special "shots" for the occasion/cocktail party.

25. THE DISTRICT CONFERENCE
