Just a reminder ...



Thanks to a recent – unannounced – upgrade of the commercial Web hosting platform that we use, our Web site went down last week, as certain components of its (now older) software are not compatible with the host's upgrade.

The site that has gone down is/was our 3rd generation site (I launched our first way back in 2001), and the high-level design of generation 4 has already been under-way, but now has to accelerate in order to get us fully back online, and with a new look at the same time.

In the short term, I'm amidst installing and custom-programming new software that will allow me to bring most of the "brochure" portions of our site back online so that the public can be aware of our work. Interactive things like the member database won't be available during this time. Once that interim step is complete, the process to modernize our site's look will get underway, in addition to incorporating the latest technology for member management and other interactive features.

I don't have a time estimate for the final 4^{th} generation yet, but it is a big job. I'll let you know more when I can estimate better. I expect the interim site to be up by the time we meet this Wednesday.
