Million Dollar Journey

As your District Rotary Foundation Committee Chair, I am so excited to see the progress that is being made on our Million Dollar Journey. So many dedicated Rotarians have shown that they want to leave their Legacy to Rotary and have either made gifts, or pledges, or have made arrangements in their estate plan for our Foundation.

Congratulations to the participants, and a very hearty THANK YOU!

So, what are some of the things Rotarians are doing?

1. Making an outright gift of \$10,000 or more to the Foundation
2. Pledging \$10,000 or more over three years and making the first installment now
3. Naming the Foundation as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy or retirement plan
4. Making other arrangements in their estate plan, or gifting appreciated stock or other assets
5. Those who are 70 ½ and have an IRA account are using the Qualified Charitable Distribution option

(Note- although the Required Minimum Distribution age has changed, the QCD date has not)
These are just a few examples and we encourage you to think about it and consult your advisors to see what works for you. In most cases, all you have to do is make your arrangements, then complete a simple form to let the Foundation know what you have planned.

If you have been procrastinating, please start thinking about it and planning now. This campaign is open until October 2020 and will wrap up with a gala event in November for all those who have either gifted, pledged, or made a bequest designation of \$10,000 or more.

By supporting our Foundation, we are not only serving our own communities, but we are changing the future for the world's children by promoting peace, preventing disease, supporting education and literacy, and providing clean water and sanitation. Where do you fit in this picture?
