1974-75

Sand Box Project

A new project developed. The club members built 4x4 or 5x5 stained sand boxes. The four corners had plywood seats, but the unit did not have a bottom for easy drainage. In May, the members delivered the empty boxes and boarded dump trucks loaded with sand. At each stop we unloaded the wheel barrow, hand shoveled it to the rim and wheeled three loads into each box. Individual loads could be ordered also. Boxes sold for \$25 5x5 filled, \$20 4x4, or \$3 for just sand. Chairman Julius Crocker sold special dispensation buttons to members not willing or able to deliver in May.

Sales:	\$774.50
Expenses:	\$313.30
Profit:	\$461.20

Fruit Cake Sale

Club members were asked to sell Holiday Fruitcakes for \$5, at a cost of \$3.95. Each member was encouraged to sell a dozen. The Downtown club assisted and sold 106. The final total was 141, for about a \$400 profit.
