# Recipe of the Week Karlene Leatherman

If you've been to Dick Ames' Founders Picnic ... you've had these. Enjoy!

#### Calico Beans

1# ground beef (browned)

1# bacon (fried to desired crispness)

1/2 cup chopped onion (sautéed)

1 tsp salt

1 Tbl vinegar

dash ginger

1/2 cup white sugar

1/2 cup brown sugar

1/2 cup catsup

1 tsp dry mustard

1 – 55 oz can Bush's Baked Beans \*\* (do not drain)

Combine all.

Bake uncovered @ 350° for 30-45 minutes.

Or place in crock pot on high for 2 hours ... basically until the sugars have melted and everything is heated through

\*\* original recipe calls for

1 - 15-1/2 oz can kidney beans

1 – 15-1/2 oz butter beans

1 – 31 oz can pork & beans

... hence the name "Calico Beans"
