Famous Rotarians

Next time you are rummaging around in the freezer for some frozen peas spare a thought for Rotarian Clarence Birdseye (1886-1956).



At a time when frozen foods were neither common or satisfactory for large scale sales and distribution, Birdseye, who was working for the US Dep't of Agriculture developed a rapid freeze technique that preserved all the nutrients of food without any of the cell damage that previously rendered thawed foods unpalatable.

While today we consider this a trivial convenience, it revolutionized food production and distribution and meant that hundreds of millions of tons of fresh foods would no longer go to waste each year.

Birdseye was a member of the Rotary Club of Gloucester MA.

Day by Day Warming Shelter meal

Italian Garden Vegetable Soup

- 2 - 14-1/2 oz cans chicken broth
- 1 - 14-1/2 oz can diced tomatoes
- 1 - 15-1/4 oz can whole kernel corn, drained
- 1 - 15 oz can peas & carrots, drained
- 1 - 14-1/2 oz can French style green beans, drained
- 1-1/2 cups cooked chicken, cut into bite-size pieces
- 1 tsp basil
- 1 tsp fresh garlic
- 1 tsp oregano

Combine all ingredients, bring to a boil; reduce heat. Simmer, uncovered until heated through.
