Today we welcome (via Zoom) American film actor, Mark Valley. In a previous career Mark

served with the US Army in Berlin and in the Gulf War after graduating from West Point. With the Cold War wrapping up, Mark took his efforts to the stage and became a versatile and reliable performer known for bringing a comedic angle to dramas as a lead or regular on network television shows like Boston Legal, Harry's Law, Keen Eddie, and Human Target. Valley is also the creator of the award-winning web series Zburg about a distressed post-industrial community, and his espionage-based podcast The Live Drop.

He's published short stories and has television pilots in development to include an adaptation of Air America pilot Neil Hansen and Luann Grosscup's book *Flight*. Currently Valley's in production on a documentary called *Red Elvis* for Curiosity Stream about the American performer Dean Reed.

Based in Los Angeles, Valley can be seen in his garage cycling through France on his new Peleton.

India Battles Covid-19



Undoubtedly you've seen the horrific news of COVID-19's impact on India. Although

somewhat improved since early May, throughout the Indian subcontinent over the last week, there have been an average of over 150,000 people falling ill per day and over 3,200 deaths daily, with areas in the south being particularly hard-hit.

Our Rotary district, through multiple Rotary Friendship Exchanges over the past few years, has established trusted, strong relationships with counterparts in two Rotary districts in the southern part of India. Seeing the devastation in those areas, our district contacted our counterparts in those two districts to see if there could be ways for us to help.

Our counterparts have verified the extreme need for assistance for those in their communities, and have created four distinct projects that can save lives. Each of these projects is in need of funds, and while the Rotary clubs in India are raising funds locally, there is opportunity for Rotarians, Rotary clubs, and friends of Rotary here in our Wisconsin district to help as well.
