# More Funds to Rotary for Polio Eradication

Another high tech-originated foundation has stepped into the charitable tailwind created by the Gates Foundation's November, 2007 \$100 million challenge grant to the Rotary Foundation for polio eradication.

On February 14, Rotary International announced that the Google Foundation had made a \$3.5 million challenge grant to the Rotary Foundation, with the expectation that Rotary will match the challenge dollar-for-dollar over the next year.

Since 1985, Rotary has helped immunize nearly two billion children and contributed \$650 million to the global effort to eliminate polio.

Globally, the number of polio cases has fallen from 350,000 annually in the mid-1980s to approximately 2,000 cases in 2006. there are now only 4 polio-endemic countries in the world: Afghanistan, India, Nigeria, and Pakistan.
