#### Bowling FUN-Raiser

Many clubs I've talked to are looking for ideas, so here are a few:

1. Start a career counseling or vocational training program and invite non-Rotarian community members to attend.
2. Organize a discussion or workshop on workplace ethics and invite local non-Rotarian business leaders to attend.
3. Sponsor a career day in which club members bring young people to their places of business.
4. A club in Nevada hosts a breakfast to celebrate the start of a new school year and to express appreciation for teachers, administrators, and support staff at local schools. The school year has begun, but why not do this at semester break?
5. A club in New South Wales, Australia, hosted a Pride of Workmanship Awards event and honored workers whose managers nominated them for recognition.
6. An E-club in Texas partnered with a local community college and hosted a vocational training program to teach inmates at the county jail how to repair bicycles. The club provided tools, supplies, and broken bicycles and the refurbished bicycles were given to low-income children in the community.
