Rotary receives District Grant to address local needs



Empowerment Station

Oshkosh Southwest Rotary recently received a \$3,000 Rotary District Grant to address Period Poverty at Oshkosh North and Oshkosh West high schools. The funds will be used to purchase a cabinet and supplies for each school. Females at Oshkosh North and Oshkosh West with limited financial resources will benefit from this project. The community will further benefit by having female students who are able to succeed in school, allowing them to contribute more positively to the community.

Period Poverty is the lack of access to menstrual products, education and safe sanitation facilities. A 2014 UNESCO report found that 1 in 10 menstruating youth miss school due to lack of access to menstrual products. Poor menstrual hygiene can also lead to serious health conditions. Approximately 16.9 million people who menstruate in the US live in poverty, and two-thirds of those could not afford needed products in the past year.

Oshkosh Southwest Rotary seeks to address this issue locally through the Period Poverty grant. Rotarians will be involved in setting up "empowerment stations," providing the ongoing replenishment of supplies, and continuing conversations with school staff to maintain the provision of educational opportunities (pamphlets, posters, workshops, etc.).

The need for the project came up when the grant committee started discussing ways our club could make an impact in the community for Women's Health month. After talking to school social workers, the committee determined that we could make a large impact on the girls in the high schools by providing feminine hygiene items for those who can't afford to buy them, thus helping countless girls in Oshkosh by raising their self-esteem, decreasing absenteeism in school, improving mental health, and more.

While this project will be led by Oshkosh Southwest Rotary and its members, we are also coordinating with two Oshkosh-based organizations, including the *Oshkosh Herald* and the Women's Fund of the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation, which launched its "Bare Essentials Campaign" on May 9, 2024.
