

Foundations Serve Greater Good

Last week Craig Burnett and Dave Omachinski enlightened the club on how the Rotary International Foundation and the Richard Ames Foundation are serving the mission of Rotary. Following is a recap from their talk.

Craig Burnett—Rotary International Foundation

The Rotary Foundation started in 1917 with the net proceeds of that year's Rotary Convention (\$26.50). That endowment became the Rotary International Foundation, now valued over \$1.33 billion. It supports Rotary's seven areas of focus including:

- Peace and Conflict Prevention/Resolution
- Disease Prevention and Treatment
- Water and Sanitation
- Maternal and Child Health
- Basic Education and Literacy
- Economic and Community Development
- Environment

Southwest Rotary members have contributed \$345,108 since the club was founded.

Dave Omachinski—Richard Ames Fund

In 1999, five Rotary members, with the help of the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation, started an endowment fund at OACF to support local organizations and causes that align with Rotary's mission. The fund was named after one of our club's founding members, Richard Ames. Some of the projects supported by the Fund include COTS, Community for Hope and the refurbishing of Little Oshkosh.

Most members contribute to both funds through their annual dues.
