

Rotaplast International

Saving smiles, changing lives.



Dr. Angelo Capozzi is a Board Certified Plastic Surgeon and cofounder of Rotaplast International. He graduated from Notre

Dame with his Bachelor of Science, followed by the Stritch School of Medicine at Loyola University in Chicago, then general surgery training at St. Francis Hospital in Evanstan, IL. He completed his plastic surgery specialty at UW-Madison.

Capozzi served as a Captain in the US Air Force as Chief of Plastic Surgery at David Grant Air Force Hospital. He went into private practice in 1968 for 30 years, then became Chief of Plastic Surgery at Shriners Hospital for Children in CA.

In 1971, Capozzi became a member of the San Francisco Rotary Club and now belongs to Tiburon/Belvadere Rotary Club. He and PDG Peter Lagarias founded Rotaplast International in collaboration with the Rotary Club of San Francisco to facilitate a surgical program in La Derena, Chile. This initial historic mission in January 1993 treated children with the cleft lip and palate anomaly, who would otherwise not receive surgical intervention.

As a project of the Rotary Club of San Francisco, and for the first three years of its existence, Rotaplast completed one surgical mission a year. The following two years, Rotaplast completed two missions a year. In 1996, Rotaplast became a separate nonprofit corporation and has since expanded its annual missions.

In December 2023, Rotaplast sent its 258th mission and has served more than 21,000 patients in 26 countries.

Capozzi now devotes his practice to humanitarian medicine and international service. He's been on 76 international trips with Rotaplast and currently serves as Rotaplast's Medical Director and International Committee Chair.
